School District Open Enrollment

Wisconsin's interdistrict public school Open Enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they live. Applications may be submitted to no more than three non-resident school districts. Students in 4K through grade 12 may apply to participate in Open Enrollment. Parents should call their resident school districts to find out if their preschool-aged children qualify for Open Enrollment. The Open Enrollment application period for the 2025-26 school year is from February 3 - April 30, 2025 until 4:00 p.m. Parents must apply to the non-resident district. A nonresident district is defined as the district in which you do not live, but where you want your child to attend. It is recommended that you apply for Open Enrollment through the on-line application process at http://dpi.wi.gov/oe. The Open Enrollment application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2025. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason. If

4K REGISTRATION INFORMATION

4K Registration for the 2025-2026 school year opens February 3, 2025!

Who can participate?

Any child, who is four-years-old on or before September 1, 2025 and lives in the school district boundaries, is eligible to participate in our 4K program.

Can my child attend Holmen's 4K program if they attend daycare in Holmen?

If an age-eligible child attends daycare within School District of Holmen boundaries, please complete the Open Enrollment process. You will hear from our Student Services Department in April or May regarding whether your child was accepted for Open Enrollment. Upon acceptance, you will be able to register for 4K in Holmen.

How do I enroll my child?

Go to www.holmen.k12.wi.us and click on "Enroll a Student" along the right side of the page. Starting this fall, 4K will be housed in all four elementary schools. Creative Curriculum Interest Area: Classroom Library

The Library Area is a very important part of your child's classroom. It's where children gain the foundation for reading and writing. It's also a place where students can relax and enjoy the wonderful world of books.

We encourage students to look at books, listen to recorded stories, retell stories, and "write" their own stories throughout the day. Sometimes children dictate stories to an adult, which we record for them.

We read stories to the children every day. Reading introduces new ideas, helps students learn how to handle problems that come up in life, and mostly encourages children to develop a love for books. As children listen to us read, their own reading skills begin to develop.

Here are some of the things we do as we read:

- Look at pictures and ask: "What do you see?"
- Encourage children to predict what will happen next: "What do you suppose will happen now?"
- Encourage children to repeat words, rhymes, and phrases they've memorized.

What You Can Do at Home

Research has shown us the important role families play in helping children learn to read and write. The single most important thing you can do is to read to your child every day. When your child sits next to you as you read, he begins to connect books with good feelings. Here are a few more things you can do with your child.

- Encourage your child to talk about the stories you read.
- Ask questions like, "I wonder what will happen next, or "I wonder why..."
- Try to relate the story to something in your child's life ("That looks just like Grandpa's dog!")
- Visit the library and check out books that interest your child.
- Give your child paper and pencils, pens, or markers and let him experiment with writing.

If you would like some help choosing books, or guidance on how to read with your child, please let us know. To keep your child's home library well stocked, you can draw on the resources of our local public library. When you take the time to read to your child every day, you are doing the very best thing to help your child grow up to be a successful reader.

Speech Update: Modeling Reading Behavior

As your children watch you read, they will begin to develop an awareness of what people do when they read. When reading familiar stories to your child, point to the words as you read and encourage your child to read along with you. This will model where the words are, where to start reading, and that we read from left to right. If your child is beginning to show an interest in letters, occasionally you may point out a familiar letter (especially those in their name). Also, it is important to talk about the pictures and how the pictures can help us figure out what the words are saying or what is happening in the story.

You can have your child create his/her own picture stories. Ask the child to draw a picture and to tell a story about it. Write down the story and then ask your child to read it.

Remember to read to your child regularly and to use reading activities as a teaching tool. By reading and talking about picture stories with your children, you can help them develop language, thinking, and reading skills that are essential for success in the classroom.

From the Health Office: Health Office Update Emily Hanes BSN, RN

With hat season upon us, I would like to bring to your attention the possible spreading of head lice. Good head hygiene habits are essential. If your child complains of an itchy scalp, we encourage you to check your children's heads for the presence of any lice or nits. Head to head contact is the most common form of transmission. Lice do not jump or fly from head to head, but crawl. Articles such as combs, brushes, helmets, towels, pillowcases, hats, hair accessories, or other head coverings also aid in the spread of head lice. Please discourage your child from sharing these personal items.



When checking for nits, if it removes easily from the hair, it is not a nit. Nits are attached by a strong glue to the hair shaft, about one to two inches from the scalp. Lice can live 1-2 days on a surface without a human host. They live about a month on the scalp, and the female louse can lay 6-10 eggs (nits) a day.

If you believe your child has head lice, please contact the health office for assistance with treatment and eradication. We are here to guide you and your student through the process.
