Drivers of School Owned Vehicles and Private Vehicles (A.K.A. Alternative Vehicle Drivers)

There are occasional activities that require transportation services that are not readily available, inconvenient for an employee, or by their choice they prefer to drive themselves using a school van or to use their own vehicle. There are other times that parents or others volunteer to drive vehicles to assist the school in providing service to the school and students. The district has established policy guidelines and procedures that can allow for these activities. (Please allow one week for processing.)

Insurance Coverage When Using Private Vehicles

Employees need to be aware of the following when they use their own vehicle for transportation. "Except for commuting, if you drive your own vehicle in the course of your employment with the School District, you have supplemental coverage under the School District's liability insurance. However, your personal insurance is primary. If you drive a School District vehicle in the course of your employment with the School District, you will be covered under the School District's insurance." In other words, if the accident is in the employee's vehicle the employee's insurance coverage would be primary, district coverage secondary. If the accident is in a school district vehicle the district coverage applies. The coverage follows the vehicle.
