- find out who your child's teacher is
- have school pictures taken (Don't dress your child in green. A green screen is used.)

Sara Lenz and Allissa Vandermus, our Administrative Assistants, have been busy preparing for Registration and the upcoming year. Our custodial team, Ms. Sam, Mr. Ryan, and Mr. Nao, are working non-stop to ensure our school sparkles in time for Open House on August 29th. Children can bring their supplies, see their classroom, and meet their teacher(s) that afternoon between 4pm and 6pm. As always, we have many staff working behind the scenes planning, growing professionally, and volunteering around our community. We love what we do and are committed to student learning.

You will find information in the following pages on important dates, transportation, Registration information and more. If your child is entering Kindergarten, you will also learn about our **Kindergarten Kick-Off**, which is extra important for planning purposes.

#### SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Classes begin promptly at 8:30am. Students are dismissed between 3:25 and 3:30pm. This year, full morning supervision will begin at 8:10am on our playgrounds and in the lunchroom for students who choose to eat school breakfast. Limited supervision will be provided starting at 8am for families who need to drop children off and for District transportation that arrives earlier than scheduled. On Early Release days, students are dismissed between 1:25 and 1:30pm. School day schedules with lunch and recess times will be available for pick up at Registration and on our school website.

When students arrive on the bus, they are dropped off next to the lower playground. All students should enter the playgrounds through the gate. Students in grades K-2 place their belongings on the lower playground and students in grades 3-5 place theirs on the upper playground. Students that participate in the breakfast program proceed through the upper level doors to the cafeteria, and they take their backpacks with them.

Individuals who are dropping off students or projects before school and would like to go to a child's classroom should sign-in at the office before doing so. For supervision purposes, children should exit the building with the accompanied adult if not eating breakfast. All students need to be outside if not eating breakfast before school.

If it is necessary for a student to be picked up prior to dismissal time, please plan for a few extra minutes to stop in the office. We will notify the teacher to send the child to the office when you arrive.

#### **SCHOOL SAFETY**

To ensure safety for all, we ask your cooperation in the following school procedures:

#### Visitors and Volunteers:

- To ensure safety, all doors to our school will be locked during the school day and all parents and visitors during the school day will be "buzzed in" at the green door in the front of the building.
- In order to minimize classroom interruptions during the school day, individuals dropping off school supplies, treats, projects, etc. should leave them in the main office. We will see that they get to your child's classroom.
- Only registered volunteers will be allowed in the hallways and instructional areas during the school day.
- For specific events throughout the year, we will direct you to Door E, which is in the back of our school. You may park in front, on the side or behind the building for those specified events. Buses park in the center of our front lot at the end of the day, so please avoid that lot between 3 and 3:45pm.

#### Drop-off and Pick-up:

- For quick drop-off/pick-up, use the loop in the front of the building (Door J). Drivers must stay in the car and keep pulling forward. Avoid parking in the stalls in the loop. Staff will see that your child safely finds you in the loop.
- The large lot is only to be used for staff parking and buses before and after school. If you need to get out of your car to pick-up your son or daughter, parking is available on Long Coulee Road or in the parking lot on McHugh Street. Meet your child(ren) right outside of the main entrance (flagpole) if you do not use the loop. A staff member will be at the flagpole waiting with children. The front lot is reserved for buses to ensure safety and timely delivery of children to their drop-off locations.
- Please remind your child(ren) to use the crosswalk on the corner of McHugh and Long Coulee. We have a staff member assisting with traffic after school to allow children to cross those streets safely.
- When using the bus and staff parking lot between 8:45 and 3:00, please use the North entrance for entering only and the South exit for exiting only.

Taking these small steps will assist us in this process while keeping everyone safe and systems running smoothly.

#### KINDERGARTEN KICK-OFF

If your child is entering Kindergarten, you will also learn about our **Kindergarten Kick-Off** at Registration. We want you and your child to feel as safe, comfortable, and informed as possible starting the year at a new school, so on September 1st, your incoming kindergartener will come to school with you or a family member for <u>only one hour</u>. Together you will get to know the teacher, learn about the daily schedule and expectations, and take a tour of Evergreen. Our "Kindergarten Kick-Off" replaces the first day of school for kindergarteners. The first full day of school for kindergarteners will be on Tuesday, September 5th. We appreciate your partnership in ensuring our students begin their time at Evergreen feeling cared for!

#### TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

Transportation information will be sent via email from our transportation department. More information can be found on the <a href="mailto:Transportation">Transportation Web Page</a>. If you have questions or concerns regarding transportation, please call the Transportation Office at 608-526-4752 or email at <a href="mailto:transp@holmen.k12.wi.us">transp@holmen.k12.wi.us</a>. If you have a change in your pick-up or drop-off location from last year, or you have a student who is new to our district, transportation should be requested by completing a Parent/Guardian Transportation Request/Change Form <a href="mailto:Click Here">Click Here</a> (found at bottom of page) or emailing <a href="mailto:transp@holmen.k12.wi.us">transp@holmen.k12.wi.us</a>. Be sure to check out the <a href="mailto:Transportation Facebook Page">Transportation Facebook Page</a>. Watch for an email from Travel tracker for busing information.

All students are given an identification wristband on the first day and asked to wear it for the first week of school. The information on the wristband will include your child's name, bus driver's name, bus route number, and drop off location. If your child will not be riding the bus at a given time, notify your child's teacher and transportation. No bus passes will be issued in the 2023-2024 school year due driver shortage and buses being near capacity.

#### **GOIN' GREEN**

As many of you already know, Evergreen Elementary School continues to make a sincere effort to be more environmentally friendly (Goin' Green). If possible, we eblast information, so having a current email address in Infinite Campus is very important. #### **CHILD CARE**

Before and after school childcare is offered onsite by the <u>YMCA</u> for school-age children. After school care is also offered by the <u>Boys and Girls Club</u>. Families are responsible for all costs associated with these services, and both have scholarship dollars available. Please be aware that there will be no after school care when children are dismissed early due to weather conditions, so you will need to have plans in place for these rare occurrences.



# Holmen Nutrition Services Student Universal Nutrition (S.U.N.) Program Information 23-24

#### WHAT IS S.U.N.?

S.U.N.-Student Universal Nutrition, a program of the Holmen School District-Holmen Nutrition Services. The S.U.N. program strives to provide the highest quality meals for the students of the district, serving both breakfast and lunch. Many hours go into providing students with nutritious and delicious meals during their school day. Every day there are a variety of great choices, including some of our award-winning Farm to Table ingredients, which meet all requirements of a healthy meal set by USDA's Child Nutrition Program.

#### **MISSION STATEMENT:**

The vision of the SUN Program, within the School District of Holmen is to find the solutions to advance the nutritional and educational goals of the district through:

- helping to educate our students as to the importance of healthy eating habits
- providing nutritionally balanced meals
- striving to teach lifelong nutritional values, to not only students but the community as a whole
- representation of the school district in a professional way that will insure its credibility in the community

#### **MEAL COST INFORMATION:**

Meal prices will remain the same for the 23-24 school year, with breakfast for all students at \$2, and lunch for elementary students at \$3. Holmen Nutrition Services and the School District have also generously approved students qualifying for reduced meals to receive one reimbursable breakfast and lunch free of charge again this year.

#### **MEAL PROGRAM INFORMATION:**

Nutrislice is an interactive web-based menu tool that provides greater insight and information about our menus. The Nutrislice website lets guardians & students see pictures, descriptions, nutrition information, and carb counts for each day's menu. Menus can be accessed from the school district website, www.holmen.k12.wi.us, and click on the menus icon > click "Get Your School Menu." Once there, select your school from the drop box, and select breakfast or lunch menu. You can also download an App to your smart phone that will allow you to see the same information right on your phone! Keep in mind, these are tentative menus, and they are subject to change at any time based on product availability.

The meals at the School District of Holmen are kid pleasing and nutritious. We also run a variety of promotional days, which give the students a chance to win prizes, dress up in special ways and listen to music at lunch time - all while enjoying a nutritional meal!!

#### **COMPUTERIZED MEAL SYSTEM:**

The Holmen School District utilizes a Point of Sale System, which is used during meal time to track student purchases. This will allow you to track your students' purchases online via our Infinite Campus system, as well as give you an up to date account balance, and make payments. All students are connected to a family ID number which all family members debit from the same account. This allows you to make one deposit into your family account and all payments are credited immediately. Please ensure your account has funds prior to students utilizing all meal services. When your account becomes low, (\$10.00 or below), you will receive an automated email reminding you to put money into your family lunch account. We also use an automated daily email reminder if your account happens to go negative. Family lunch accounts must have a positive balance per District Policy.

If you choose to send payment, please make checks payable to S.U.N and write your Family ID Number in the memo section of your check or on your cash envelope. This ensures that your money is deposited into the correct family account. \*Note- Checks returned for non-sufficient funds are subject to a penalty.

#### ONLINE PAYMENTS THROUGH THE INFINITE CAMPUS PARENT PORTAL:

The School District of Holmen provides parents/guardians access to their student's lunch account information via our web-based Campus Portal. The Campus Portal provides families the flexibility to pay online at any time using credit or debit (Master Card, Visa, and Discover) or checking/savings account. This program provides instant access to these funds by students. The processing fee for online payments is \$2.00 per transaction. In addition, all meal transactions can be viewed using the Infinite Campus Parent Portal, which can be accessed online at www.holmen.k12.wi.us > Parents> Infinite Campus Parent Portal. Another option is to set up recurring payments (based on low balance or monthly) to avoid having to receive low balance emails. This can be done within the Infinite Campus payment portal as well.

#### **REFUNDS**

Refunds for Family Accounts will be provided only if the family moves out of the district or all students in a household have graduated. Any money left in the family account at the end of the school year automatically rolls over to the next school year.

#### **BREAKFAST PROGRAM INFORMATION:**

A Great Way to Start Your Morning! Breakfast is served daily. Breakfasts feature an entree, juice or fruit, and milk. Please check your specific school information for daily breakfast service times.

#### **FIELD TRIPS:**

When your student goes on a field trip, it can be difficult deciding what to pack for your student's lunch. Wouldn't it be nice to eliminate the hassle? We can help! A sack lunch can be provided by the nutrition program with nutritious and delicious options. Online forms will be sent by your school a few weeks prior with the selections if you wish.

#### FEDERAL APPLICATION FOR FREE AND REDUCED MEALS:

This is a Federal program regulated and audited by the Federal Government. Families are encouraged to apply, as this also provides funding to our district in other areas, as well as provides free testing, and free athletic fees, etc to students. A family can apply anytime throughout the school year. If your family qualifies through Medicaid, SNAP, or other state benefits, a notice indicating you have been approved through Direct Certification should be sent to you by mid to late August. If you have not received this notice by late August, one application per family is all that is needed. Families experiencing economic hardships are encouraged to apply. A new application must be completed each year, as the Federal Government sets new income levels each year. This information is kept confidential.

ONLINE APPLICATIONS are highly encouraged! These can be filled out and submitted through the parent portal by going into Infinite Campus, Parent Portal in your menu options select More>Meal Benefits>Applications/Forms, applications can also be downloaded from the School District website, and paper applications are available at all schools as well as the District Office.

NOTE- Free/reduced students are not eligible for free milk during meal time, when they bring a cold lunch from home. Milk taken with cold lunch by your student needs to be paid with cash or from your family account. Cost is \$.60 per carton.

In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA. Persons with disabilities who require alternative means of communication for program information (e.g. Braille, large print, audiotape, American Sign Language, etc.), should contact the Agency (State or local) where they applied for benefits. Individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing or have speech disabilities may contact USDA through the Federal Relay Service at (800) 877-8339. Additionally, program information may be made available in languages other than English.

To file a program complaint of discrimination, complete the USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form, (AD-3027) found online at: http://www.ascr.usda.gov/complaint\_filing\_cust.html, and at any USDA office, or write a letter addressed to USDA and provide in the letter all of the information requested in the form. 
### Dear Evergreen Families!


