

What is Fair Use?

 Fair use is a policy that was developed in 1971 as part of the copyright law to protect teachers and schools and allow them to "borrow" copyrighted works

Single Copying for Teachers

 A single copy may be made by a teacher for research or use in teaching or preparing to teach

- A chapter from a book
- An article from magazine or newspaper
- A short story, essay or poem
- A chart, graph, diagram, cartoon, picture

Multiple Copies for Classroom Use

 Multiple copies (not to exceed one copy per student) may be made if:

- The copying meets the tests of brevity and spontaneity
- Each copy includes a notice of copyright

What is brevity?

- A poem less than 250 words
- An article, story or essay of less than 2,500 words or 10% of the complete work
- One chart, graph, etc. per book or magazine

Spontaneity

- Copying is at the instance and inspiration of the teacher
- The decision to use the work is so close in time that it would be unreasonable to expect a timely reply to a request for permission

Prohibitions

- There should be no copying from works intended to be "consumable".
 - –Examples : workbooks, test booklets

Prohibitions continued...

Copying can not...

- -substitute for the purchase of books, reprints or magazines
- -be directed by higher authority
- -be repeated for the same piece by the same teacher year after year

Examples of things you cannot copy under law

- Complete scripts of plays/musicals
- Complete workbooks for classroom use
- Complete magazines (like Weekly Reader, Time for Kids)

Copyright Permission

 If you want to use copies without infringing copyright you may write to the author or publisher and clearly explain that you are requesting permission for educational use only

Copyright

 These are just reminders to help you stay within the law.

 There have been instances where schools/teachers have gotten into legal trouble for photocopying materials without heeding copyright laws

Fair Use Policy

 The School District of Holmen does have a Fair Use Policy approved by the school board.
