
• In order to achieve our vision, our department will: prepare digital age learners to be efficient and ethical users of information/technology and nurture a sense of personal interest and love of reading.

Wisconsin Administrative Code PI 8.01 (2)(h)

(h) Library media services. Each school district board shall:

- 1. Have on file a written, long-range plan for library services development which has been formulated by teachers, library and audiovisual personnel and administrators, and approved by the school district board.
- 2. Designate a licensed library media person to direct and coordinate the district's library media program.
- 3. Provide library facilities within the school building and make available to all pupils a current, balanced collection of books, basic reference materials, texts, periodicals, and audiovisual materials which depicts in an accurate and unbiased way the cultural diversity and pluralistic nature of American society.
- 4. Provide library media services to all pupils as follows: to pupils in grades kindergarten through 6, library media services which are performed by or under the direction of licensed library and audiovisual personnel; and to pupils in grades 7 through 12, library media services which are performed by licensed library and audiovisual personnel

During the development of the Wisconsin Digital Learning Plan, the Future Ready Framework was adopted as a way to organize key priorities and planning tools for districts.

The Future Ready Librarian Framework will be a guide to support and improve library programming in order to prepare Holmen School District students for a successful future. This model serves to align the goals of our library media program with the Future Ready School Framework, which serves as a key resource for the Wisconsin Digital Learning Plan. Collaboration between librarians and key stakeholders is crucial to promote and implement innovative learning opportunities for students.



Current Status: Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment




- Library instruction supports general education classroom curriculum when possible
- Curate print and digital resources that support curriculum and student interest according to selection policy

Current Status: Personalized Professional Learning



- Opportunities to share in buildings (staff meetings, TILT, SWIN)
- Opportunities to teach at District PD events
- MS and HS are able to collaborate with PLC teams due to more flexible scheduling
- MS and HS maintain Staff Resource Courses within Canvas that contain a variety of training resources

Current Status: Robust Infrastructure



- Access to databases and other digital resources in elementary, middle, and high school buildings
- Access to ebooks through Wisconsin Digital Consortium for elementary buildings
- Access to ebooks through district owned Overdrive collection for middle and high school buildings
- 1:1 in grades 3-12
- Wi-fi network throughout buildings
- Hot spots are available for families without access to internet at home

Current Status: Budget and Resources



- Common School Funds are spent to provide students and staff with high quality print and digital resources that support curricular goals
- Funds are spent to support makerspace programs that are appropriate for students at each building
- Utilize Inner District library loans and state wide
 WISCAT loans to provide students and staff with print materials

Current Status: Community Partnerships



- Partnership with La Crosse County Library system to promote and share public library programs
- Partnerships with local businesses to promote literacy programs (Loggers Baseball and Mathy Construction)
- Partner with Elementary building PTOs for read-a-thons
- Book fairs at the elementary and middle level that are open to families

Current Status: Data and Privacy



- Teach digital citizenship lessons K-12 that promote:
 - online safety
 - importance of securing personal and private information
 - responsible and ethical use of the internet and resources

Current Status: Collaborative Leadership




- Collaboration with PLC teams at the middle and high school level
- Middle and High School librarians participate on District Technology Committee
- Librarians participate in building wide committees
- Teach lessons that support general education curriculum

Current Status: Use of Space and Time



- Libraries are adding more flexible seating areas/furniture
- All libraries have access to makerspace materials
- Libraries are open throughout the day and staffed by full time library assistants
- High school library has conference rooms for small group work



Goal 1

- Conduct a collection analysis for each building
- Identify areas of need to increase diversity
- Update collections based on analysis and continue current purchasing practices based on student/staff need and reputable, professionally prepared selection tools

Goal 2




Librarians will work to find additional ways to collaborate with teaching staff within their buildings in order to align lessons and provide resources that support curricular goals.

- Present ideas to teachers

- Modify and develop lesson plans to cover priority standards
