Since 1956, Lions Camp has been dedicated to providing a quality camping experience for residents of Wisconsin with disabilities. Our primary objective is to provide a fun, safe and memorable camping experience which will have a positive impact on the camper's life.

COST

There is no cost for any of the Camp sessions. A \$25 refundable application deposit is required to prevent no-shows.

SESSIONS

Sessions run Sunday through Thursday. Campers are responsible for their own transportation to and from Lions Camp. Volunteers will be called on to provide transportation for campers as needed.

ACTIVITIES

The daily schedule begins at approximately 7 a.m. and ends at 9 p.m. Campers have a rest period each afternoon. Some of the activities offered are swimming, boating, fishing, archery, arts and crafts, ropes course and a variety of non-competitive sports. All activities are supervised by trained staff.

APPLICATIONS

Camper and staff applications can be obtained on our website: www.wisconsinlionscamp.com or by contacting the Camp Office. Camper applications are available each year in January. Staff applications are available in November and as needed throughout the year.

ELIGIBILITY

In general, all campers must be a resident of the State of Wisconsin or attending school in the State of Wisconsin. They must be independent in their self-care skills, including being fully toilet trained. They must be socially and behaviorally able to function within a 1:6 staff to camper ratio. Specific requirements vary by population (please see requirements on the right).

POPULATIONS SERVED

YOUTH WHO ARE DEAF OR HARD OF HEARING (DHH)

- Ages 6-17
- Any of the following degree of hearing loss: profoundly deaf, mild, moderate or severe hearing loss (20-90 db loss) without amplification in either or both ears
- Receive or eligible to receive support services

YOUTH WHO ARE BLIND OR VISUALLY IMPAIRED (BVI)

• Ages 6-17

- Any of the following degree of vision loss: totally blind, legally blind (20/200), low visionvision of 20/40 or less with correction, or vision in one eye only
- Receive or eligible to receive support services

YOUTH WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES OR AUTISM (IDA)

- Ages 10-17
- Has an educational placement in a program serving those with intellectual disabilities, autism, or receiving other service
- Educationally or socially functions as having an intellectual disability

YOUTH WITH DIABETES (DB)

• Ages 10-17

- Has a current diagnosis of type 1 or 2 diabetes
- At least one year post diagnosis at time of camp

YOUTH WITH EPILEPSY (EP)

- Ages 6-17
- Has a primary diagnosis of epilepsy or other seizure disorder

ADULTS WHO ARE BLIND OR VISUALLY IMPAIRED (BVI)

• Ages 18+

- Has the same degree of vision loss required for youth
- Be able to function independently

ADULTS WHO ARE DEAF OR HARD OF HEARING (DHH)

• Ages 18+

- Has the same degree of hearing loss required for youth
- Be able to function independently

YOUNG ADULTS WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES OR AUTISM (IDAYA)

- Ages 18-25
- Previously attended Lions Camp as a youth
- Campers are drawn in a lottery to receive
- applications due to the limited number of spaces
