Objectives For Families


- Families will understand resources for post secondary planning.

Winter of Junior Year

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- ☐ Use resources to prepare for the ACT (pg 9)
- Give some thought to the types of schools that best fit your needs/interests & gather information
- ☐ Meet with college or military representatives that visit HHS (pg 14)
- Attend career exploration events, seek out youth apprenticeships, volunteering, or attend Trade Tuesdays during lunch (Check student email to see these opportunities.)

Spring of Junior Year

- ☐ Use resources like XELLO or Find Your UWs Tools to help find schools (pg 7)
- Compare and contrast list of college choices and plan campus visits or job shadows (pg 17-18)
 - Allowed up to 2 school days to use for Academic & Career Planning (ACP)
 - Send tour confirmation or documentation of a job shadow to our attendance email (hhsattendance@holmen.k12.wi.us)
- Complete ACT test at HHS with classmates (March 19th, 2025) (pg 9)
 - ☐ UW System schools- test optional through Summer 2027
 - Save copy of ACT ID after you receive your results (will need if sending scores to additional schools)
 - Some scholarships have ACT requirements
 - ☐ If waitlisted to a college, ACT scores are encouraged

Spring of Junior Year

- Plan challenging curriculum for senior year
 - Some post-secondary institutions will not accept students who have senior releases or study halls in their senior year schedule College & Career Ready
 - Allow for exploration within your course requests and align courses that match your career goals
 - ☐ AP, Transcripted or Dual Credit Classes (pg 10-12)
- Create a formal resume to have ready for job applications
- Create, save and update activities resume from Personal Finance (for HHS scholarships)
- Submit Start College Now or Early College Credit paperwork by March 1 for fall / Oct. 1 for spring college classes



- End of July Direct Admit offer letters are sent out to students (pg 8)
- August 1 November 1
 - Apply ONLINE to colleges of choice and observe deadlines
 - If using Common App, link XELLO account & see your counselor
 - Submit official transcript from XELLO
 - Application fee (Madison, UWL, and Eau Claire)

Direct Admit

10 of the 13 UW universities review student academic records (high school courses and GPA) at the end of their junior year and make offers of admission to participating UW universities without the need for students to submit a traditional admission application.


- 4 units of English,
- 3 units of approved math (must have taken Algebra 2)

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- 3 units of social science
- 3 units of natural science
- 4 additional academic units

Can accept offers until May 1, 2025

Traditional applications will need to be completed for UW Madison, UW La Crosse, & UW Eau Claire


