Senior Year Timeline

2 year / 4 year

FALL OF SENIOR YEAR

- Plan final campus visits (if still needed)
- Ask for letters of recommendation (if needed)
- Retake ACT if necessary (September or October test dates)
- August-November 1st (some institutions may accept summer application)
 - Apply ONLINE to colleges of choice and observe DEADLINES
 - OFFICIAL ACT scores sent (www.act.org) (optional for many schools)
 - Submit **official** transcript from Xello
 - Send in Application fee
- Apply for financial aid via FAFSA website
 - Must be accepted to colleges before financial aid can be assigned
 - Deadline is changing
 - Call institutional financial aid offices for additional help
 - College Goal (January 23, 2024) for FAFSA help @ Onalaska HS

NOVEMBER - MAY OF SENIOR YEAR

- Scholarship overview presentation (November 9th at 7pm in FAC)
- Apply for scholarships
- Make final choice for college attendance (consider financial aid package awarded)
- Register for the ASVAB if interested in military or career exploration October 20, 8am
- Register for College Placement tests at your college of choice - take before June
- Apply for tuition reciprocity if you are planning on attending a Minnesota college.

JUNE

- Have an official final high school transcript send to the Admissions Office
- Send AP scores to your institution
- If you have earned college credit while in high school, request all final college transcripts to be sent to the Admissions Office

FALL OF SENIOR YEAR

- Meet with recruiter
 - Take ASVAB (October 20, 8am) sign up in SS
- Review schedule for classes that align with your career goals
 - Allow for exploration
- Work on resume/list of job skills
- Volunteer in an area of interest
- Talk with Mrs. Seipp if interested in exploring apprenticeship opportunities (set up by November 1st if interested)
- Look for part-time job to build skills

NOVEMBER - MAY OF SENIOR YEAR

- Make any changes to resume and new skills learned
- Search for job opportunities
- Continue meeting with your recruiter

JUNE

- Finalize resume
