OPEN ENROLLMENT

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they live. Applications may be submitted up to three nonresident school districts.

Students in 5-year old kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment. The Open Enrollment application period for the 2020-21 school year is from **February 3-April 30, 2020.** Parents must apply to the nonresident district. A nonresident district is defined as the district you don't live in, but where you want your child to attend.

It is recommended that you apply for open enrollment through the on-line application process by clicking here. You may also download and print a paper copy by visiting the WI DPI Open Enrollment Page by clicking here.

The open enrollment application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2020. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.

Four-Year Old Kindergarten (4K) Registration

The School District of Holmen will begin accepting enrollment for the 2020-2021 Four-Year-Old Kindergarten (4K) Program on Monday, February 10th. Any child, who is four-years-old on or before September 1, 2020 and lives in the school district boundaries, is eligible to participate. We encourage early registration in order to help us plan accordingly for the 2020-2021 school year. **Note: All enrollment is done online – www.holmen.k12.wi.us**

This year, students in Mrs. Wilber's class aren't just learning academics but also becoming more mindful, balanced humans thanks to generous donations.


















Where is your favorite place to be?

We recently attended a training to educate us on implementing the next level of support and are ready to get started! We are calling this program PV PALS. PV PALS reinforces our students being safe, respectful, and responsible across their day in all settings. If your child will be participating in this program, you will receive a call from their classroom teacher and additional information will be sent to you. We are excited to offer this new program and are confident that it will have a positive impact on our students!

COUNSELOR CONNECTION

It's been a great start to the New Year here at Prairie View! The PVers have been busy learning about Diversity and appreciating our differences in January. In February, we will be exploring career planning in the upper grades and we will be introducing self-management and self-awareness in the lower grades.

Our PBIS team has been undertaking a Tier 2 training this year and have been working hard to implement a new layer of support to our kids utilizing our new behavioral data management system, EduClimber. Educlimber is "a data platform to aggregate, visualize, and analyze academic and behavioral data, support PBIS and RtI strategies, and collaborate with data faster and more easily--all in one place. The result is actionable data that allows educators to make informed decisions that will help students succeed." We are excited to roll out our new check in/check out system this month to best serve our students. Pick:

- Choose firm, smooth-skinned potatoes, free of wrinkles and sprouts.
- •Discard potatoes with soft or rotten spots as the flavor will be affected.

Store:

- Depending on variety, potatoes can be stored for up to a couple months in a cool, ventilated area.
- •Do not store whole potatoes in the fridge.

Prepare:

- •Wash and scrub the potatoes before use.
- •For quick cooking, simply pierce a washed potato with a fork & place in the microwave for 3-5 minutes or bake at 375 degrees for 15-30 minutes, or until soft.

Nutrition Info

One medium potato has 150 calories and provides vitamin C, potassium and fiber.

Fun Facts

Of the more than 5,000 varieties of potatoes in the world, the most common is the red potato.

The Irish called the potato a "spud" after the spade that was used to dig them, called a "spudder"!

Many people believe potatoes to be the root of the plant, but they are actually a tuber – an underground stem.

Uses

The entire potato is edible! Wash well, but keep the skin on for added fiber.

Instead of using butter, sour cream and cheese, try spicing up potatoes with olive oil and seasonings such as black pepper, rosemary, garlic, or basil.

Garlic Potato and Cauliflower Mash

Serves 12 (1/2 cup per serving)

Ingredients:

4 large russet potatoes, peeled and chopped into medium chunks

2 medium heads cauliflower, cut into quarter size florets

2 Tbsp. butter

½ cup plain Greek yogurt

¾ tsp. salt

½ tsp. dried thyme

1 tsp. garlic powder

1/2 tsp. ground black pepper


Directions:

Bring water to a boil in two medium sauce pots. Boil potatoes and cauliflower in separate pots until each are fork tender, about 10 minutes; remove from heat and drain. Place cauliflower in a food processor and process until smooth, about 2 minutes. Place potatoes and processed cauliflower into a large bowl and mash using fork or potato masher. Add the butter, yogurt, salt, thyme, garlic and black pepper. Mix until all ingredients are well-incorporated, about 2 minutes.


